RECIPROCAL PRINCIPAL AUCTIONEER / APPRENTICE APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

A reciprocal applicant is an individual holding an auctioneer license from the proper authority of a state, territory, or possession of the United States of America or the District of Columbia for at least one calendar year and that state has a reciprocity agreement with the Kentucky Board of Auctioneers.

- Contact your current license state to forward to the KY Board a "Certification of Licensure/Letter of Good Standing", verifying your initial licensure date, license number, a current active license and status of your license. Some states charge a fee for this service. (This letter/certification may be sent to you by your state and enclosed with this application.)
- Print or type all answers. Do not use a pencil.
- Answer all questions and attach a recent 2" x 2" passport-size photo.
- Applicant's signature in Section 17 must be witnessed, certified and sealed by any Notary Public.
- Submit the application and attachments, and a check payable to the Kentucky Board of Auctioneers.

The licensure fee correlates to your state of licensure (includes a Recovery Fund fee of \$30).

- All licenses are mailed to the business address. All other correspondence is mailed to the "mailing" address. The business address and business phone numbers are published in the Kentucky Directory and on the Kentucky Board's website.
- The social security number is only used in-house for verification purposes.

SUMMARY OF LICENSING PROCESS

To change your home &/ business address, submit notice, the license and a check for \$15. The Kentucky Board of Auctioneers does not license firms, only individuals.

The renewal form is mailed to a licensee's "mailing" address in May. The completed renewal and fee must be received by the Kentucky Board on or before June 30th of each year.

ALL RECIPROCAL LICENSEES MUST SUBMIT A COPY OF YOUR CURRENT LICENSE OR YOUR POCKET CARD FROM YOUR RECIPROCAL LICENSE STATE.

If your license state requires CE, then the reciprocal licensee does not report continuing education hours to the Kentucky Board of Auctioneers. If the license state does not require continuing education, then the reciprocal licensee must report 6 hours.

Continuing education (CE) is earned between July 1st of the previous year and June 30th of a renewal year. KBA has seminars each year.

The Kentucky Board of Auctioneers accepts continuing education courses from Certified Auction Institutes, Auction Schools, KAA, NAA and other state/national auctioneer associations. Submit a copy of the proof of continuing education by fax (502) 429-7147 or mail if CE was earned from a sponsor other than the Kentucky Board of Auctioneers.

If the continuing education is not earned in the CE year, the license is canceled.
